Dear Friends of ShareCare,

It is said the home is where the heart is and where better to stay healthy and age well than in one's own home, in the beauty of Leelanau County. Healthy aging means finding new things you enjoy, staying physically and socially active, and feeling connected to your community and loved ones. ShareCare helps make this possible for any Leelanau County senior citizen in need.

Aging in community can be the preferred choice of the elderly and is an affordable option. To stay at home, older adults depend on family and friends. This is particularly true in rural areas where transportation and social services are limited. However, many seniors live alone, with few social connections or family nearby. That is where ShareCare steps in; we understand the value of aging at home and the support needed to make it possible. Since 1994, we have worked to make this a reality for thousands of seniors.

Volunteers are a critical component of our success. Over 100 volunteers helped a senior last year: from a simple phone call, providing a ride to a medical appointment, delivery of groceries, and a lot of things in-between. Those delivering a service often benefit as much as the recipient, and many of ShareCare's volunteers are senior citizens themselves.

Early in the year, many new volunteers came on board to deliver groceries and prescriptions, and reached out to seniors who live alone to ensure they could remain safely at home. In total, volunteers delivered nearly

2,000 services and drove 22,345 miles to transport seniors to necessary medical appointments.

Unfortunately, fundraisers and social events were cancelled last year. Zoom helped us connect with many volunteers and seniors for workshops and meetings, and over the summer a few safely distanced activities were allowed to occur, including a memorial for those who lost a loved one during the year, a fall picnic for volunteer drivers, and the support group for spouses of people with dementia.

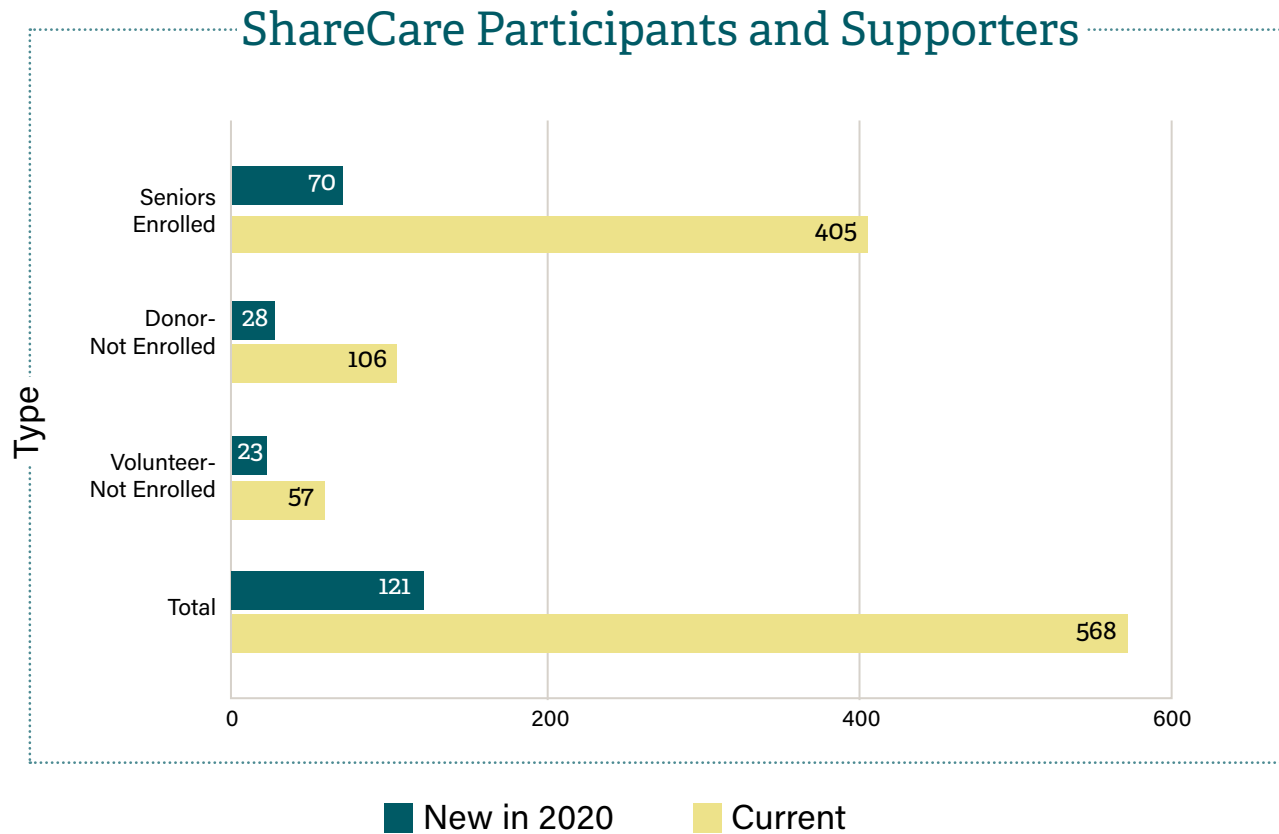

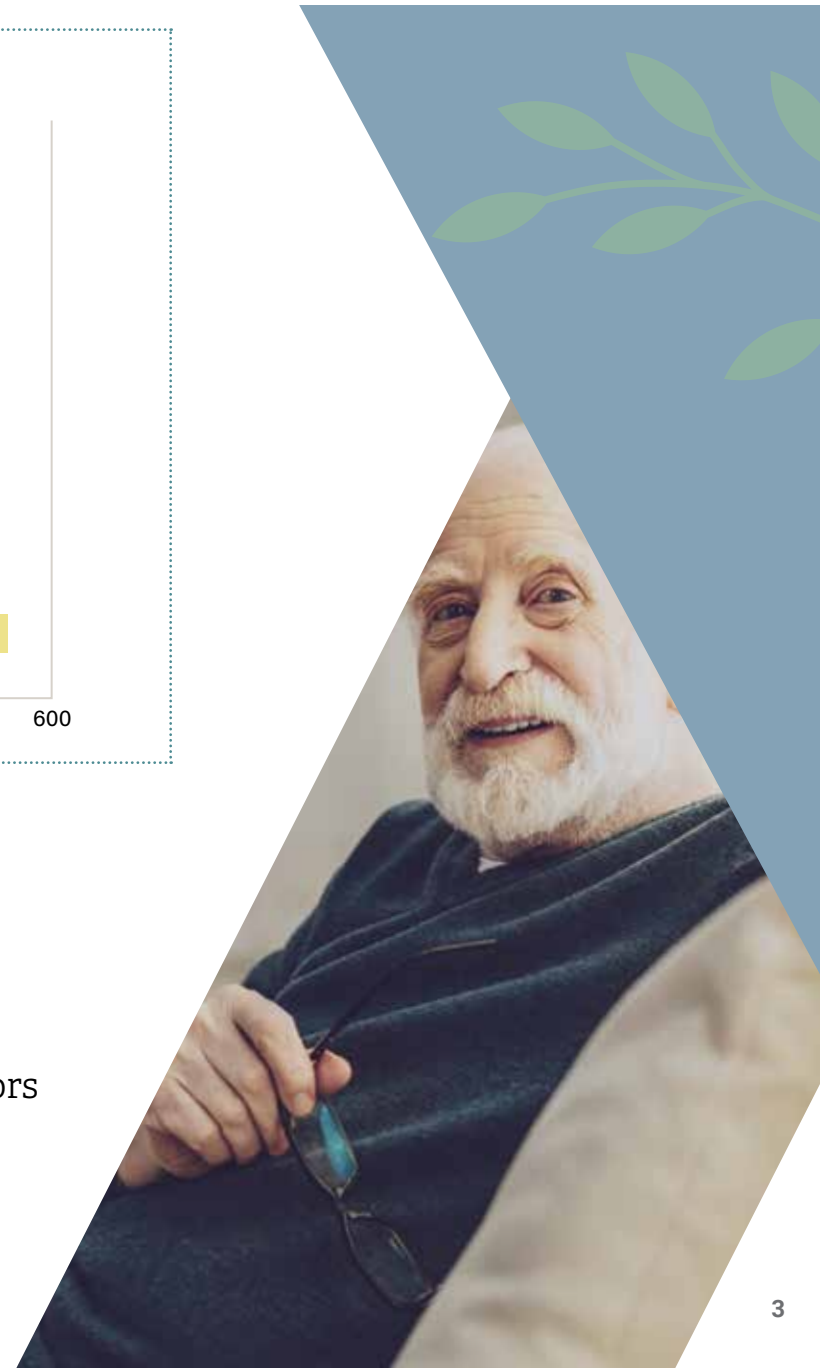

Highlights



Last year ShareCare increased its reach to 568 people. Seventy seniors enrolled in ShareCare and 23 additional volunteers signed-up to help them remain safely at home. First-time donors to ShareCare's year-end fund drive increased by 28 donations.





ShareCare could not exist without its nearly 100 volunteers. Their assistance during a year of COVID-19 was especially important to allow seniors to remain at home safely. Many volunteers get as much out of helping a senior as the seniors they assist. Pam Bradshaw, a volunteer and ShareCare Board member, helps Rosalind Ryant, a 90-year-old Maple City woman, who recently moved into an assisted living facility in Traverse City. Pam continues to visit Rosalind regularly in her new home. She also picks up groceries, runs errands and calls regularly for a friendly chat. Bob Chase, a volunteer driver with ShareCare, helped Reuben Chapman get to his physical therapy appointments. They live close-by and it was a way to help someone in his community.

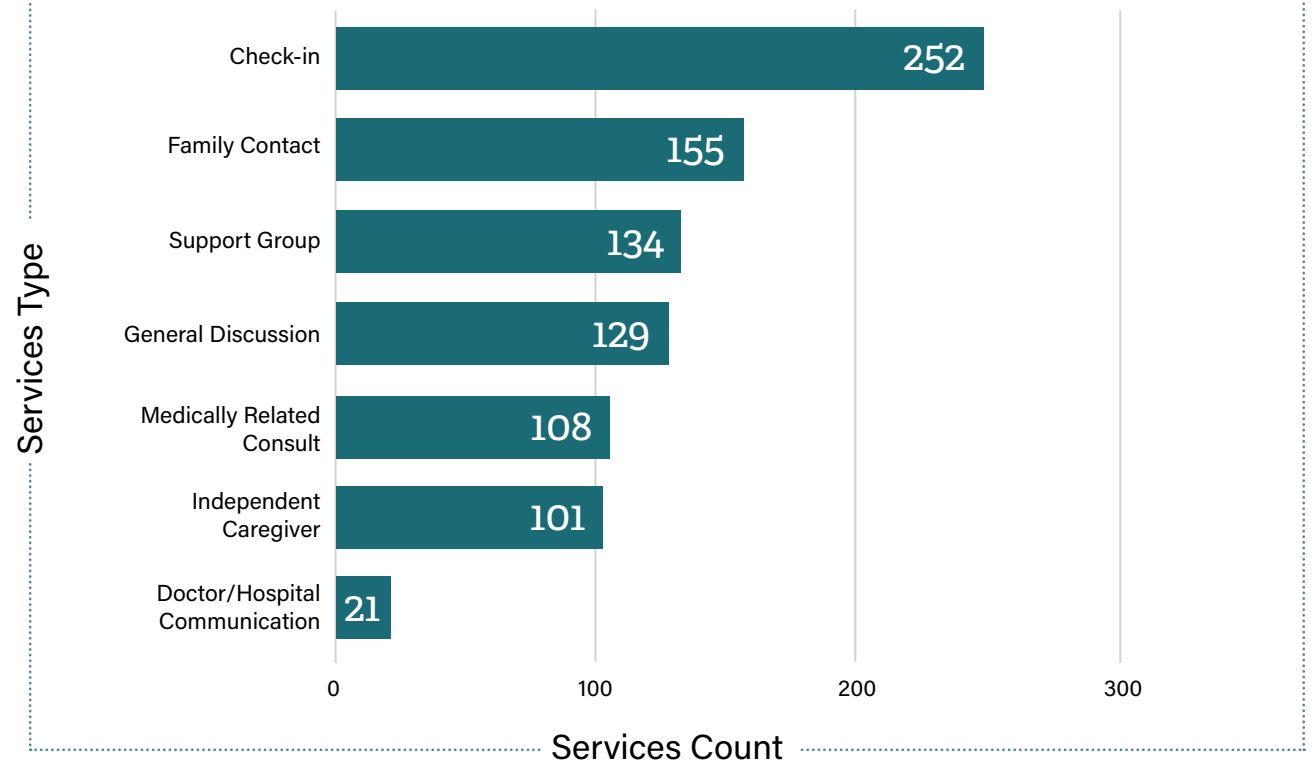
In 2020, volunteers donated 1,597 hours helping seniors with chores, checking-in by phone and providing transportation. Drivers, who use their own vehicle to transport seniors to medical and wellness appointments, deliver groceries and run errands, drove 22,435 miles last year.

Care Coordination Services

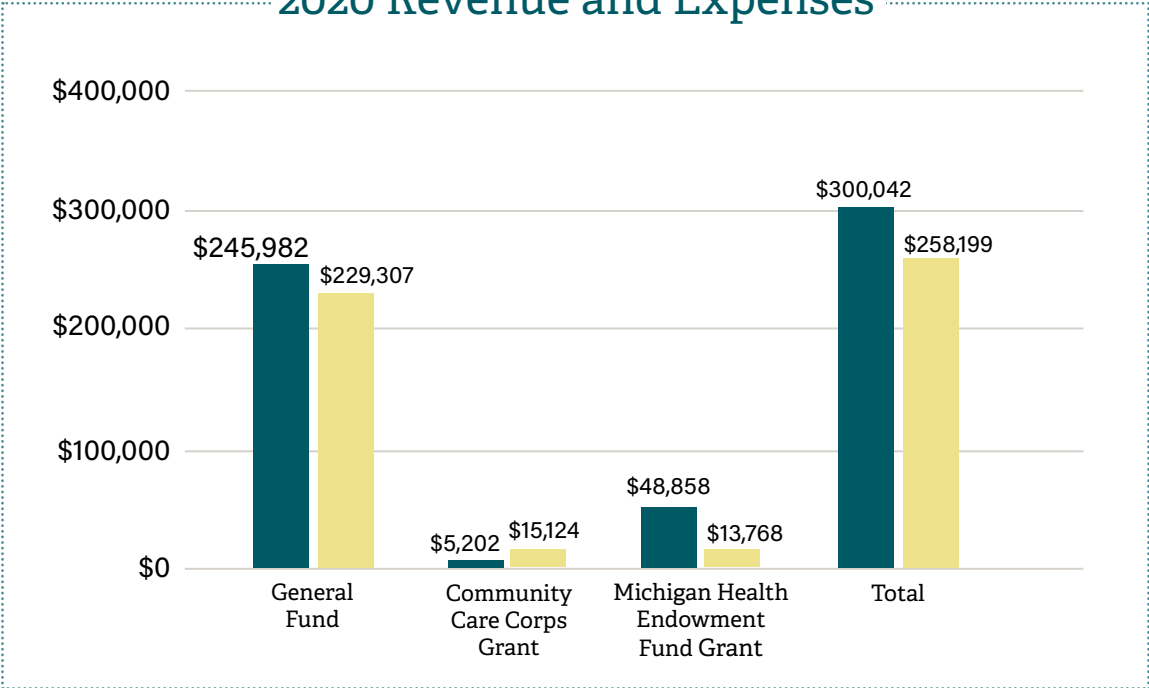


Care Coordination services provided by our nurse ranged from check-in's and general discussions to supporting people with more immediate needs like coordinating a medical issue with family members, the doctor and hospital. Another service that was in high demand last year was finding independent caregivers for those needing assistance with activities of daily living skills.

Financial Picture

2020 revenue exceeded expenses overall, with a year-end surplus of \$41,843. Three grants contributed to the positive cash flow, and unexpended funds in these revenue sources will roll over into 2021.

2020 Revenue and Expenses

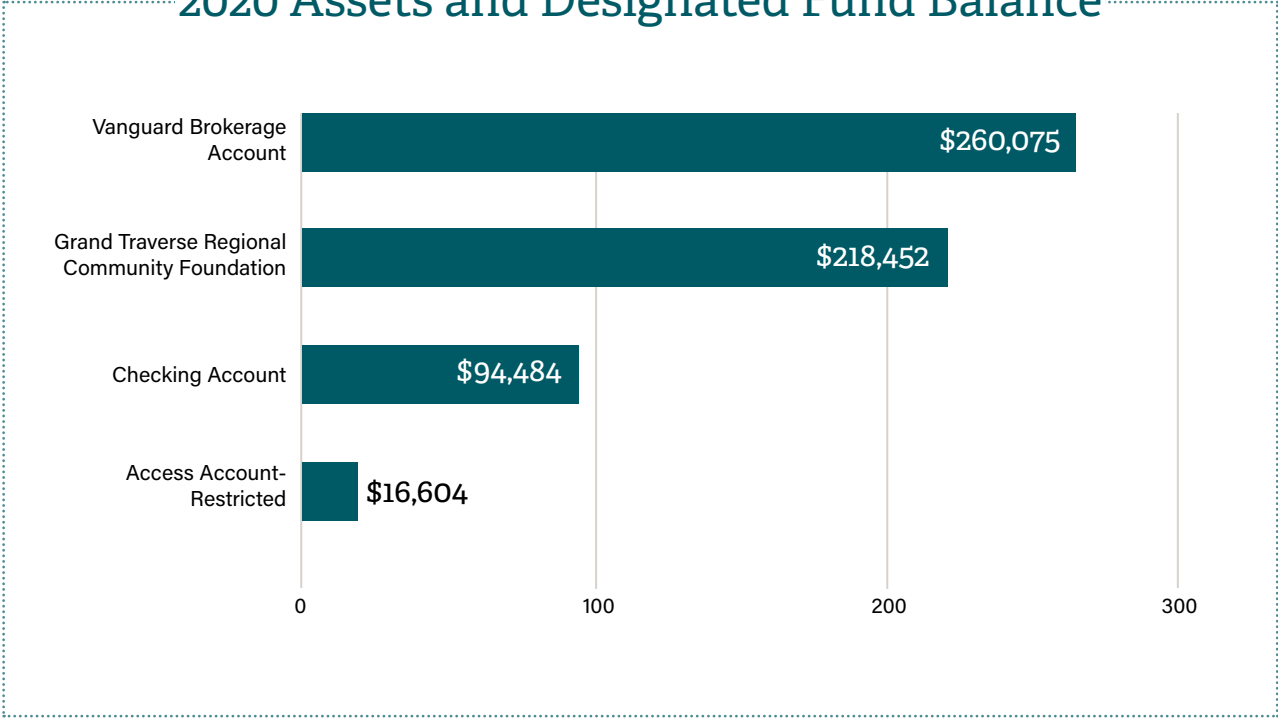


■ Revenue ■ Expenses

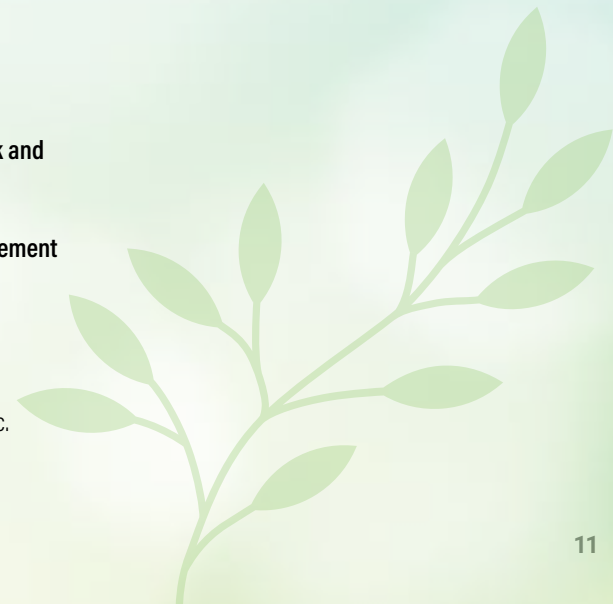
